Thus apart from the individual dynamics, a social group worker must understand group dynamics or various concepts of the group process. The concepts like acceptance or refection, isolation (neglected and reflected) sub groups, group bonding, group hostility and group contagion, group support and group conflict are studied under group dynamics.
