Every year, an estimated 21 million girls aged 15-19 years in developing regions become pregnant and approximately 12 million of them give birth. 1 At least 777,000 births occur to adolescent girls younger than 15 years in developing countries. 2

SEATTLE — Twenty-thousand girls under the age of eighteen give birth every day in developing countries, and complications related to pregnancy and childbirth are the leading cause of death among adolescent girls aged 15-19. Half of these pregnancies are unintended and result from lack of access to reproductive health education, child marriage, sexual violence and low levels of education.

### Teen Pregnancy and Education in Developing Countries

Every day in developing countries, 20,000 girls under age 18 give birth. This amounts to 7.3 million births a year. And if all pregnancies are included, not just births, the number of adolescent pregnancies is much higher. When a girl becomes pregnant, her life can change radically. Her education may end and her job prospects diminish.

Going on down the line following Niger are Mali (175.4438), Angola (166.6028), Mozambique (142.5334), Guinea (141.6722), Chad (137.173), Malawi (136.972), and Cote d'Ivoire (135.464).
