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Kongo Gumi Braiding Instructions

The name originates from the Japanese – Kongo means ultra hard and Gumi means braid. To make this braid you will need. 4 strands of coloured cord 70 cms long. 4 strands of a contrasting coloured cord 70 cms long. A foam braiding disk like the one in the pictures below. This is long enough for a friendship style braid to fit your wrist.

These instructions are for one of the simplest braiding structures called kongo gumi (= hard braid), which produces a solid cord with a round crosssection (as opposed to a shoe lacestyle hollow cord or a flat braid).

How to Kumihimo?: Kumihimo Patterns for the Kongo Gumi Braid

Kongo Gumi Braids Kongō Gumi is the 16-element braid that most Kumihimo Enthusiasts learn as their first braid on the foam disk. Arranged into eight pairs, one element from a pair moves downwards toward the pair on the other side, while an element from the opposite side moves upwards to reform the pair.

Here is a picture of what you need to make the spiral braid called in Japan, the Kongo-gumi. The traditional silk in 4 different colors is shown in the top picture. You can also use a single strand of a thicker thread, such as silk embroidery floss or pearl cotton shown in the second picture.

Kongoh gumi braids are probably the first kumihimo braid people come across. This is a Z-spiral kongoh gumi – the Friendship Bracelet kits I have seen come with instructions for making this form, so I tend to think of it as the “normal” form. It is very easy to make this braid on a kumihimo disk (also called a Friendship Wheel).

Checker (Edo Yatsu Gumi) Braid (1/2) Please put the threads on the disk as shown, 6 dark threads and 2 light ones. ROUND 1: The dark thread at the north on the left skips over it's light-colored neighbor and goes to the north of the two threads on the right as shown below.

Please keep in mind that not all of these braid structures are Kumihimo. To be correctly labeled as "Kumihimo" the braid structure must have an identifiable Japanese origin. To fill the hollow centre of a beaded Round Braid/Kongo gumi. When you make an 8 cord braid without beads the centre of the braid is closed up. When you add beads on some of the cords, the beads will sit on the outside of the braid and the centre of the braid will remain closed.

Z Spiral Kongoh-gumi This is a braid from the Japanese Kumihimo tradition. It is one of the simplest braids to make on the braiding disk - in fact it is as easy as 1 2 3. Make up a warp of 8 elements (50 to 60 cm is good for samples). For this example, I have 4 elements in colour A and 4 in colour B. Load up the disk as shown below:

Kumihimo is a traditional Japanese artform of making braids and cords. Literally meaning "gathered threads", kumihimo are made by interlacing reels of yarn, commonly silk, with the use traditional, specialised looms - either a marudai (圓盤) (lit., "round stand") or a takadai (高盤) (also known as a kōdai).
