Perseus and Medusa Theater

Perseus finds Medusa asleep inside her cave and makes sure not to wake her. Perseus takes the reflective bronze shield from Athena and holds it up to use as a mirror to locate Medusa. Walking backward towards Medusa, Perseus continues to hold the shield in the air to keep a clear view of Medusa, making sure to only look at Medusa in the shield. As Perseus crept closer to Medusa, he wielded the sword that Hephaestus had given him and beheaded the monster.

The Myth of Perseus and Medusa Explained

Here, we will present just a short version of the myth of Perseus and Medusa - until the moment when Perseus beheaded Medusa. Perseus and the Oracle Acrisius, the king of Argos, was told by the oracle of Delphi that his own grandson would kill him one day. This grandson would be the child of his daughter Danae.
