Putting such blind spots aside, Richards convincingly argues that Darwin is not a source of Hitler's anti-Semitism and that Hitler's conception of the fixity of race was non-Darwinian. Darwin emphasized an ethic of altruism, cooperation, and community, again in contrast to Hitler, who was especially scathing about university academics.

Several scholars and a host of religious conservatives have argued that Hitler derived his anti-Semitic racism from Darwin's theory. They suggest this connection morally taints Darwinians and undermines evolutionary conceptions. Careful examination shows that Hitler's racial views had no connection with Darwinian ideas; indeed, he held to the fixity of species and thought descent of human beings from animal forbearers absurd.

Richards argues that Hitler's racial theory came from "one source in particular," i.e., H. S. Chamberlain, and since Chamberlain rejected Darwinian evolution, then Hitler's views were not Darwinian, either. 7. Richards states that I ignore many factors that gave rise to Nazism.

The last chapter demolishes the putative links between Darwin and Hitler. First, Darwin was no anti-Semite unlike Hitler, of course, whose anti-Semitism was derived from elsewhere and the centrepiece of his world view. Moreover, Hitler rejected Darwin's contention that humans and apes descended from a common ancestor.
